

Bulk Ammo Buying

Some shooters shoot the popular 12 and/or 20 gauge and do not reload. They hope to save by buying inexpensive promotional loads often found early in the hunting season, and by buying these in bulk. This is quite often a bad choice as these promotional loads are often high velocity hunting loads that result in high amounts of felt recoil. For a high volume shooter, recoil is never a good thing.

So what is a value conscious shooter to do? They need to find the best bulk target ammo deal they can find. The best one that SR has found at this time is at CAC Associates:

CAC recently updated their web site and the Remington ammo is now POR or price on request. The RIO target loads are the lowest price Google has found on the net. Naturally these prices do not include shipping. For it to make any sense, one needs to keep the cost of shipping as low as possible. So one needs to

- 1 have a loading dock to receive pallet shipments,
- 2 ship as close to 100 cases/pallet as possible
- 3 buy at least 200 cases of ammo.

If you can do 1, 2 and 3 you can get ammo probably for 10% less than retail. Perhaps it is time to get some good friends together and do an ammo buy.

The RIO TLT28 is a sweet load for those who are using double guns. It is a one ounce load @ 1210 FPS that you can shoot all day without ill effect. We're not sure if it will cycle reliably in semi-auto shotguns. Try before you buy.

For those who absolutely need every pellet, the RIO TLT32 is a 1 1/8 ounce @ 1150 FPS load that delivers a bit more recoil than the TLT28. These should cycle in semi-autos, but try before you buy.

The Federal Top Gun prices are pretty good also. Call CAC for Remington prices. Last we heard the price was pretty good. For reloaders, currently nothing reloads as well as the Remington STS hulls.
